Big Game: John VanEtten NYS published stats for last year. Hunters in NY took 223,364 up from 209,000 previous season. Below the 5 year average. 122,427 antlered deer. 100,87 antlerless deer taken, 66.9% of bucks. Age of bucks was up 2 1/2 year olds. Passing up small buck is waking up from 52% from 10 years of age. Surplus from 3,189 for over 3,189 deer - no CWD statewide in 2024. Bow Hunting: Ray Otto July 12th weekend event, Into the Wild. 3-D shoot for bows at Holiday Mountain.
