Introduction of guests: Michelle Poprawski, Manager of Catskill Fish Hatchery (Region 3), Logan Grisaber, Asst. Manager of Catskill Fish Hatchery, Amber Gray, District Technician of Sullivan County Soil & Water Conservation District, and ECO G. Parker

Michelle Poprawski updated delegation regarding recategorization of NYS Trout streams. This included "accessibility, size of streams, carrying capacity and angler pressure" (per slide presentation).

4 sets of letters to landowners, that are stocked by DEC, are being sent out. Letters basically are asking if they are continuing to allow angler access or not, and if they have fishing permitted signs or not. When accessibility is not permitted, the stocking will be stopping. The signage is being updated, too. Regional offices have until October 2024 to get these in to State offices for adjustments or changes being made in 2026.

If there is no response by 4 letters being sent, this would indicate land owners do not consent, and fish stocking will cease at that location. This has resulted in a significant reduction of fish stocking and limited access to stream fishing, which affects counties all across New York State.

Amber Gray works for the Sullivan County Soil & Water Conservation District. They are currently selling fish. She gave the delegation a brief presentation of what fish are available and which require permits. Please go to website at sullivanswcd.org for more information about the fish.
