





Welcome to Sullivan NY Connects

Program Information

NY Connects is a locally based No Wrong Door (NWD) system that provides one stop access to free, objective, comprehensive information and assistance on long-term services and supports for people of all ages or with any type of disability. The NY Connects NWD System is administered through a collaboration between the Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs), Local Departments of Social Services (LDSS) and six regionally contracted Independent Living Centers (ILCs). NY Connects consists of the following fundamental components:

Information and Assistance – Local NY Connects programs provide Information and Assistance on available long-term services and supports options to the older population, individuals of all ages with disabilities, caregivers and helping professionals. Information and Assistance is available in through: telephone access, face to face meetings in the community or email. NY Connects can also be accessed through its statewide telephone number (800-342-9871) that connects callers with local offices by county. There is also an online resource directory of providers (nyconnects.ny.gov/consumersite/index) of long-term services and supports that provides information about the different types of such services and contact information for the local programs.

Public Education – Advertising, marketing and promotion activities are conducted to increase the visibility of NY Connects and alleviate the misconception that long-term services and supports can be delivered only in institutional settings.

Long-Term Care Councils – Long-Term Care Councils in each participating county are made up of consumers, caregivers, service providers, advocates, government representatives (AAA directors, DSS commissioners) and key stakeholders (including Independent Living Centers) who come together to analyze the local long-term services and supports system, identify gaps, duplication and barriers in the system and make recommendations for improvements. The Councils use their findings to work toward a system that is more streamlined, efficient and responsive, helping individuals remain at home and in the community. Person-Centered Options Counseling – This is an

interactive, goal driven person-centered process whereby individuals are supported in making informed long-term support decisions based on their preferences, strengths, values, abilities and resources. It includes exploring options, assisting with accessing supports/services, following-up with the individual and may result in the development of an action plan.

NY Connects enables individuals and families to identify available services and supports and choose options that will best meet their needs at home, in the community and, as necessary, in residential or institutional settings. NY Connects is driven by the following primary goals: Streamline access to information and assistance on long-term services and supports,

Reduce breakdown in service delivery through better coordination across multiple systems using a personcentered approach,

Empower individuals to make informed choices and support independent living through the provision of objective information and assistance.

Goals

NY Connects links individuals to long-term services and supports regardless of payment source/health insurance; whether it be private pay, public or a combination of both. Through the provision of free, comprehensive, objective information and assistance about long-term services and supports, NY Connects empowers individuals and families to identify available services and supports and choose what will best meet their needs at home, in the community, and as necessary, in residential or institutional settings.

ANNUAL PUBLIC HEARING & SENIOR RESOURCE FAIR



The Sullivan County Office for the Aging (OFA) is pleased to share that our recent **Public Hearing and Senior Resource Day held on October 15, 2025 at the Sullivan County Airport**, was a great success! The event brought together older adults, caregivers, and community partners to discuss the **Annual Update to our 2024–2028 Four-Year Plan** — a roadmap that guides how we deliver services, strengthen partnerships, and support independence and dignity for older residents across the county.

Participants offered valuable feedback — both in person and through written note cards — on issues such as **transportation access**, **the need for more congregate meal sites**, **health service availability**, **volunteer opportunities**, **and ways to better share information**. OFA staff also shared updates on ongoing initiatives, including the countywide **Transportation Master Plan survey** and expanded community outreach efforts.

Our **goals for the coming year** include:

- Enhancing access and outreach to ensure every older adult knows about available services
- Expanding volunteer and caregiver support programs to build stronger community networks
- **Investing in nutrition and wellness** to promote healthy aging
- Strengthening partnerships and coordination with other county departments and local organizations

We were joined by **over 20 community partner organizations**, each providing resources, materials, and direct connections for attendees. From health and wellness providers to legal aid, housing, and transportation services, the room was full of collaboration and shared purpose.

We extend our deepest thanks to all who attended and contributed their ideas — and to our partners who continue to help make Sullivan County a great place to age with dignity, independence, and community.












