



Autism Awareness for First Responders

The Center for Discovery is pleased to offer *Autism Awareness for First Responders Training* provided through the generous support and funding of the **Lieutenant Gregg Atlas Foundation**. This training is for Law Enforcement, Fire & Rescue Officers, Dispatchers, and Civilian Employees. Individuals with Autism spectrum disorders (ASD) are seven times more likely to have a 911 encounter than a neurotypical person. The number of responses is increasing nationwide at an alarming rate, as is the prevalence of autism. In the United States today, 1 in 36 children will be diagnosed with Autism.

The 4-hour session will focus on tools for agencies to address autism-related field contacts, communication and behavior, sensory issues, de-escalation techniques, arrest, restraint, and custody issues.
