



Certified Recovery Peer Advocate * Hope Not Handcuffs Sullivan County, NY

Overview: Hope Not Handcuffs is seeking a Certified Recovery Peer Advocate in Sullivan County. The Certified Recovery Peer Advocate will be responsible to

- Participate as a member of the team providing services to people with substance use disorder challenges and linking them to needed services/resources. Peers use their shared personal lived experience and training to promote participants recovery, offering support, advocacy, and skill development opportunities through one-on-one coaching and community outreach.
- Individual coaching sessions take place either face-to-face in the community or virtually. Peers manage a caseload of up to 20 participants.
- Our Quick Response Team (QRT) is an in-person community outreach program where peers are partnered with Sullivan County Law Enforcement to prevent fatal overdoses. The team visits anyone who has had a non-fatal overdose or anyone who might be at risk of overdosing, offering support and resources. Visits take place out in the community and at Sullivan County Jail. Documentation of all coaching sessions and QRT visits provided is an important component of this work.

Skills necessary to perform the job

Lived experience with substance use disorder as well as willingness to disclose lived experiences

Computer skills - MS Word, Excel & Google Worksheet proficiency

Must be comfortable working closely with law enforcement

Understanding of multiple pathways to recovery

CRPA Certification preferred but willing to sponsor to get certified (for a motivated candidate)
